Treasurer's Report

000

During 2024, HHCA did not have any major expenses. We have three accounts: a traditional bank account, Paypal, and Venmo. Periodically, we sweep the deposits from Paypal and Venmo into the bank account.

Income:

Across the three accounts we received \$30,443.61 in deposits. Membership dues accounted for \$4,999. We have generous members who gave over \$9,000 in donations. We also have very creative and energetic members who sponsored special fundraising events. Jan Spicknall and her helpers organized the Spring and Fall used books sales. Ashley Lyons coordinated the Holly Trolley tours. Matt Rhoderick, Matt Falzon and Ashley Raymond sponsored the whiskey raffle. Sam Huston, George and LeAnn Kreis, Holly Jacob and Ashley Raymond the whiskey tasting event. Melissa Huston and Ashley Raymond taught wreath making. Emily Nichols coordinated the craft fair. These events earned over \$7,000. Rental of the community center accounted for \$3,909 in revenue.

Expenses:

The largest expenses were taxes and insurance \$10,584.73, mortgage payments on the Locust Trail property \$7,542.12, mowing and maintenance cost \$5,581.11, utilities and operating costs for the community center \$2,510. Summary:

Expenses exceeded income. We ended 2024 with \$18,357.15 across the three accounts. This is \$3,200 less than last year's total balance.

Have you heard about the relatively recent phenomenon of the silent book club? Have you determined that traditional book clubs don't work for you? I'm looking for others who might want to join in this "low-impact" experience of reading in companionable silence.

Here's how it usually works: People arrive up to 30 minutes before the meeting's official start to get settled, or perhaps have a chat with others. Then someone rings a bell or makes an announcement to start the clock, and it's reading time. For an hour, that's all you do: everyone settles in for a good read in silence. At the end of the hour, one can stay behind and chat some more. Or not. The experience is akin to the quiet calm of the library but not exactly the same because people come to the library for different reasons whereas we will gather together for the same purpose.
